

## SKF Agri Hub – a guide to replacing

How to identify and replace the SKF Agri Hub on your independent tiller discs




The SKF Agri Hub is a fully integrated hub bearing system, greased and sealed for life. The hub units are easy and quick to mount and remove on virtually any implement arm.

Here's what to do if you need to change the SKF Agri Hub on your independent tillage disc equipment.

When removing the old SKF bearing, clean off any mud or dust and identify the SKF designation as indicated in the image to the right. The table on the next page shows the measurements and other specifications for a quick cross reference. This will help to ensure the correct replacement for the SKF Agri Hub is ordered from your SKF distributor.




